The children went to live with a Christian family in the countryside. They were given new names and identities and were enrolled in a new school.

The Nazis' sent the children to the concentration camps. The Nazis increased the reward for turning in the hidden Jewish children. The family the Beem children were hiding with betrayed them for the money. After the children denied being Jewish, the Nazis soldiers unclothed Abraham to find his circumcision, revealing that they were Jews. Eva was officially named a Jew in February of 1944, and was sent to Auschwitz concentration camp immediately after. At eleven

years old, Eva was killed for her faith upon arrival at Auschwitz. "Eva was only one out of 1.5 million Jewish children killed during the time of the Holocaust." (Song for Israel)

The Holocaust was a gruesome time. Personally, I didn't realize how awful it was until learning more about the era in class. I used to think these were just stories made up a long time ago.
